Project Overview

The Cruising Yacht Club of Australia (CYCA) has a design that combines modern and classic features in its traditional location on the Rushcutters Bay foreshore. The new Clubhouse has been designed to improve accessibility, increase space and flow, and enhance comfort.

Classic Solution

With increasing membership and access requirements, the pedestrian safety and enhanced access is essential across the premises as well as on the stairs.

To enable this, Classic supplied and installed SNR019 aluminium safety stair nosing for hard substrate stairs, stainless steel individual tactiles – SH10N – in natural and black across the premises as well as Poly tactile pads – PT30 – in black to ensure easy access for visually impaired individuals as well.



- Grooved 10 ring top only
- Rear nylon Stud
- Black anodised

- T316 grade stainless steel
- Grooved 10 ring top only
- Rear nylon Stud
- Sloped sides for safe transition



Tredfx PT30 TGSI

- Grooved 6 ring top
- 300 mm x 300 mm
- Bevelled edge for safe transition
- UV Resistant Poly material
